The roll-out of the COVID vaccination programme, for example. The majority of our staff have now had their first jabs, and have dates for their second in their diaries. Some of our clients and carers have also been vaccinated and we will continue to support both groups through this process. This, along with the stringent safety measures already in place at our centres, can only help reduce the risk of infection for everyone at Headway Birmingham & Solihull as we resume normal services.

Our CEO Sue Tyler says: "It is a significant step forward, and we hope the majority of our staff and clients will take up the opportunity to be vaccinated and benefit from the protection this brings.

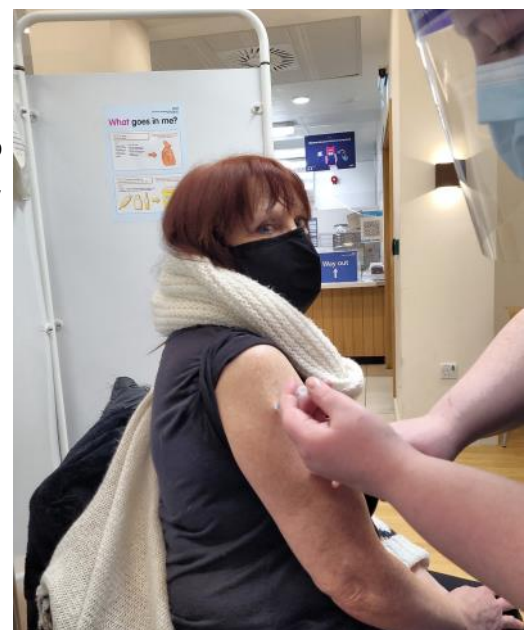
"We cannot wait to get our centres fully reopened and certainly hope that this will be the position by the time we publish our summer newsletter!"

She confirmed that Headway is continuing to offer the best support it can to clients and carers within the latest government guidelines, with Carers and Lifestyles operating near to their regular services, and ABI (Acquired Brain Injury) Services continuing to run remotely while the doors to Headway House, Leighton House and New Sutton House remain closed.

She added: "As an extra precaution, we are also asking staff to do a weekly coronavirus test, and will offer tests to clients too as they return to our centres. This will help limit potential outbreaks and offer reassurance to everyone connected to the charity."

"I loved the present and staff singing Merry Christmas to me!"

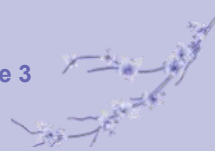
"This was such a kind gesture after the hard year we've all had."
