#### 'Ready, steady, safe to go'!

Undoubtedly, the coronavirus outbreak has been a challenge for us all, and probably the biggest faced by Headway Birmingham & Solihull in its 33-year history. However, we've come a long way since we first closed our doors and suspended our normal services back in March, and so want to update you on where we are now.



Our Carer Services are running near to normal services. Information and advice is available as usual via our Enquiry Line and our support workers continue to assess clients and offer family support. Carer Support Groups resumed in August and will take place on the third Tuesday of every month at Headway House, 4-6pm, with those attending asked to wear a face-covering and bring their own drinks. Carers Lunch Clubs will also be held on the first Thursday of every month between 2.45-4.45pm, now at Sutton House, where there is more space to accommodate everyone safely. Our Lifestyles Services are also running near to normal services, although there are a few community-based activities that are not possible due to social-distancing restrictions. Our Lifestyles Workers are offering support remotely to any client who needs to shield and will continue to do so for as long as needed. All Lifestyles Clients will be advised when lunch clubs and sports activities can resume. Our **ABI** (Acquired Brain Injury) staff meanwhile have been working hard behind the scenes preparing our brain injury centres for re-opening. A range of social-distancing measures have been implemented, with new screens installed, new signage displayed and new procedures introduced to ensure the safety of all clients as they return to each of our three hubs.

Staff have received training on the new working practices and will be operating in 'bubbles' to minimise the risk of spreading the virus. We will also be running a training week for clients to acquaint them with the new procedures.

We are still providing remote services to those isolating at home, with welfare calls, doorstep visits and a range of online information and live sessions, and these will continue until all clients can resume their rehabilitation programme at our centres. Indeed, some elements of our Remote Services have been so well-received (quizzes and

exercise sessions via Zoom) that we are looking at extending these indefinitely.

Our Sports programme has been hit hard but we have been fortunate to have been awarded some funding from Sport Birmingham which will allow us to run some sports activities from our centres in the short-term (boccia, adapted archery & table-tennis). We will take a fresh look at Community Sports as

#### We are open!

Our charity shops play a vital role in generating funds for our brain injury services and raising the profile of our charity in the local community. We are delighted to have all three open again, and would like to thank everyone who has dropped off donations to help replenish our shelves.

Anyone visiting our shops will have noticed the changes. To follow social-distancing rules, we have a maximum number of people in each shop at any one time, and ask everyone to wear a face-covering, unless exempt from doing so. We also have hand-sanitiser at the entrance and screens at our tills offering further protection to customers and staff.

As we now have to quarantine donated goods for 72 hours before they can go out on the shop floor, we are urging people to ring ahead before dropping off donations. This helps avoid turning away donations when we reach capacity, something we really don't like to do!
