'WOODLANDS' - THE NEW ANNEXE FACILITY



On 17 October Carer Peter Howell officially opened the new annexe at Leighton

House. Peter was accompanied by his wife Val, who suffered a life changing brain injury 5 years ago and is a Headway client.

The new building, located in the grounds of our Leighton House brain injury unit in Rednal, was completed earlier this year and financed by grants from several local and national trust funds. Our trustees, staff, clients and carers joined representatives from some of the trust funds to celebrate the official opening. The new building includes a training room, two other meeting rooms and a WC and kitchen area, all with disabled access.

David Chater, Chair of the Trustees at Headway Birmingham & Solihull, said: "I'd like to thank everyone involved in the project, especially those who contributed so generously towards its funding. The extra space created has helped reduce the waiting list for our specialist brain injury services and will ensure future capacity moving forwards, which is so important when demand continues to grow year on year." David also thanked Mantons, the contractors who completed the build on schedule.

The Chair expressed very special thanks to Wendy Twist, who had decided to stand down after ten years as a trustee. Wendy has also been involved as a volunteer since 1986 when her husband first suffered a brain injury.

The Chair and CEO Sue Tyler thanked all the staff and volunteers, all of whom play a crucial role in providing services to our clients.


